## Caged fury

Like Pammy Anderson, Pink and Chrissie Hynde, the struggling musician-cum-*FHM* poster girl Imogen Bailey has campaigned for People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals in the past, but this is the first time we've seen her put her body on the line for animal rights.

Bailey and the Triple J radio host Lindsay McDougall are auctioning off a chance for a lucky someone to be sandwiched with them in a human battery cage for 30 minutes on Bondi Beach. The cage is designed to highlight the cramped conditions of hens kept for egg production, and bidding at eBay, which stood at \$960 last night, closes today at 3pm.

They have a long way to go, though, before

they can hold a candle to two Animal Liberation activists who made an after-hours foray with a video camera into a piggery near Young last July.

When Windridge Farms took Animal Liberation's director, Mark Pearson, to court to get the names of those responsible, he spilled the beans.

The two "courageous activists", as Pearson described them afterwards, now face criminal charges and a lawsuit from a company called Australian Pork Ltd. They will, at least, be able to laugh at the name of the legal case.
